Statistics on labour leasing, employment of workforce leased out to Austria from EEA countries and job placement

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Executive Summary

The surveys on labour leasing, employment of workforce leased out to Austria from EEA (European Economic Area) countries and job placement have been conducted on behalf of the Federal Ministry of Labour and Economy since 2014.

The **statistics on labour leasing** provide information on temporary or agency work in Austria. The survey is conducted according to the Labour Leasing Act (Section 13 (4), Federal Law Gazette No. 196/1988 as amended). Companies and institutions that hold a business license for the leasing of labour deliver data about the assignments on a yearly basis. Information is provided on all assignments in the reporting period from July 1st of the previous year to June 30th of the current year. An assignment is a supply arrangement between a company with a business license for the leasing of labour and the employing company.

Key figures include the number of leased employees and assignments as well as the average duration of assignments in days. In addition, the statistics on labour leasing present the number of companies with active labour leasing activities, broken down by the federal province. The yearly average number of leased employees is given by the federal province of the labour leasing firm and the employing company, by sectors and trade associations according to the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber and by the main activity of the employing company. The citizenship of the leased employees, gender and the employment status (employee or worker) are also presented.

The **statistics on the employment of workforce leased out to Austria from EEA countries** provide information on the hiring out of workers to Austria by companies based in a foreign EEA country. The survey is conducted according to the Labour Leasing Act (Section 13 (8), Federal Law Gazette No. 196/1988 as amended). Austrian companies or institutions that employ workforce leased out from EEA countries according to the Central Coordination Office of the Federal Ministry of Finance (ZKO) deliver data about the assignments on a yearly basis.

Key figures include the number of leased employees sent to Austria from EEA countries and assignments as well as the average duration of assignments in days. The yearly average number of leased employees is presented by the most important countries of origin, by the federal province of the Austrian employing company, by trade associations according to the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber as well as by citizenship.

Job placement statistics provide information on the number of job placements in Austria. A job placement is any intermediation activity that leads to an employment relationship. The survey is compulsory for all companies and institutions that hold a business license for job placement according to the Austrian Labour Market Promotion Act (Section 4 (2), Federal Law Gazette No. 31/1969 as amended). The tables of results include the number of job placements in total as well as the number of job placements via web platforms. The results are broken down by main occupational groups according to OE-ISCO 08 and by federal province.
