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Evaluation of the fit2work programme since 2021

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Executive Summary

Since 2014, Statistics Austria has been evaluating the [fit2work-programme on behalf of the Sozialministeriumsservice and the Federal Ministry of Labor and Economy \(BMAW\)](#). The legal basis for this evaluation is the [Labour and Health Act](#). Fit2work offers two different counseling services: one is for people who, due to health problems, are in danger of losing their job or have difficulties finding employment. The other is for businesses that want to support the employability and health of their employees.

The evaluation design for the programme has been developed based on discussions in the advisory council and the supervisory council, as well as additional working groups. The impact evaluation of both counselling services is based on a quasi-experimental design, using a comparison group. Specific indicators of the people and businesses that attend fit2work are compared to those of people and businesses that have not participated in the programme and are as similar as possible ('statistical twins').

The success of the fit2work programme for people is operationalized as 'employed and not on sick leave'. Therefore, employment rates are calculated for the group of participants of the fit2work programme, as well as their statistical twins. Employment rates are calculated for specific dates, from one year before the start of the programme up until four years after the completion. People from the comparison group receive fictional dates for the start and the completion of the programme, these dates are derived from their statistical twins.

Three indicators are used to evaluate the effect of the fit2work programme for companies: The change in average sick days of employees, the change in average sick days for only those ICD-Codes that are relevant for the fit2work-programme (which excludes, for instance, seasonal flu), and the change in average departures into unemployment. These indicators are calculated for a one-year-period before the start of the programme and a two-year-period after the completion. Companies from the comparison group receive fictional start- and end-dates from their statistical twins.

To conduct the evaluation of fit2work, data from different administrative, as well as in-house sources are linked anonymously by a domain-specific personal identifier (bpk_AS) according to §§ 15 and 26 of the Federal Statistics Act 2000. On one hand data are used that are regularly delivered to Statistics Austria, mainly from the central social security administration and the public employment service. In addition, there are two data deliveries which Statistics Austria receives according to the Labor and Health Act and exclusively for the purpose of evaluating fit2work: First, the Sozialministeriumsservice sends a monthly delivery of data on the participation of people and companies. Second, once a year the Austrian health insurance fund (ÖGK) delivers data on the sick leaves of fit2work participants, respectively, their employees. In addition the ÖGK delivers data on the sick leaves of the statistical twins of participants, respectively their employees.

In addition to evaluating both counseling services of the fit2work-programme, Statistics Austria also analyses the overlap between both services, as well as the overlap between participants of fit2work and people who receive benefits for part-time occupational rehabilitation (Wiedereingliederungsteilzeit). For these inquiries, the same data sources that are listed above are used.

Evaluation reports are published biannually, they include detailed descriptions of the evaluation design, data sources and methods, as well as results for the evaluated years.
