Executive Summary

The Accommodation Statistics (see <u>Figure 1</u>) cover the monthly Accommodation Statistics (= tourism demand) and the annual Accommodation Capacity Statistics (tourism supply). Both statistical products provide key information about Austria's tourism, which can be used to show the potential tourism development in both regional and structural terms.

While the monthly Accommodation Statistics record the **number of arrivals and nights spent** in the accommodation establishments, the subject of the annual Accommodation Capacity Statistics is the **number of accommodation establishments and their bed capacity and occupancy**.

Both statistics are based on reports from 1 565 reporting municipalities (= municipalities with more than 1 000 nights spent per year). Since the data is not collected from all municipalities (total 2 095), it is not based on a full count, but a **cut-off sample**. Concerning the monthly Accommodation Statistics, this means a maximum underestimation of approximately 0.3% of the total nights spent.


Depending on the development of nights spent in the individual municipalities, new reporting municipalities are proposed by the federal provinces. After checking the quantitative requirements (at least 1 000 nights spent per year for several years) new **reporting municipalities** are included. Due to these **updates**, changes in nights spent at a small-scale level can be due to sampling (and not (only) development-related). Because of the large number of nights spent in Austria (around 152 million in 2019), these changes are at the most in the tenths of a percent range. Over the past 27 years, the number of reporting municipalities has fluctuated between 1 498 in 1993 and 1 565 in 2020.

First results of the monthly Accommodation Statistics are published in a press release about 25 days after the end of the reporting period; the final data is available about ten days later. The results do not include visitors who stay free of charge with friends and relatives and who account for about a quarter of the total nights spent.

Due to the necessity to update the types of accommodation establishments or the countries of origin, there are **breaks in the time series** for the corresponding characteristics. Affected are mainly characteristics where positions were merged or separated, e.g. "separation" of new EU countries from the position "other foreign countries".

The number and capacity of the accommodation establishments is collected once a year. The accommodation establishment is obliged to fill out the form by June 5th. The number of establishments, rooms and beds is published annually and is available broken down by type of accommodation (commercial and private), regionally on the municipal level and for the reporting periods from November to October and for the winter and summer season. In addition, the occupancy rate for the winter and summer season is calculated based on the nights spent from the monthly Accommodation Statistics.
